The partnership between Universal Practice and AIA Australia follows a successful 2024 pilot, which delivered outstanding clinical outcomes, operational efficiency, and patient satisfaction. Pilot members who received a 2-week personalised treatment plan saw a 31% reduction in pain score, while members who received a 10-week clinical treatment plan saw a 48% reduction in pain score.

Every patient begins with an Online Assessment, receiving a personalised Health Report and a tailored roadmap to guide their recovery or performance goals. Recognising that healing extends beyond a single appointment, Universal Practice offers intelligent, adaptive Al-driven logging and tracking systems, an always-accessible talk-to-a-physio chat function, pre-recorded exercises, and in-house educational resources. The goal is not just to ensure recovery, but to empower patients to take ownership of their mind, body, and wellbeing.

"Not everyone has access to quality healthcare, or the guidance and motivation to see rehabilitation through," says Sammy Prowse, Principal Physiotherapist and Co-Founder.

Many Australians suffer from musculoskeletal conditions not because treatment doesn't exist, but due to gaps in accessibility, affordability, support, education, and follow-through. Universal Practice addresses this critical need, providing continuous, uninterrupted access to best-practice healthcare.

Universal Practice uses **proprietary Body Mapping Technology**, which tracks movement in real time via any device, improving diagnostic accuracy and ensuring exercises are performed correctly.

The platform also offers:

- Al-driven exercise logging and adaptive tracking
- Always-on "Talk-to-a-Physio" support
- Tailored Rehab, Strength, Pregnancy, and Seniors Programs
- Daily science-backed workouts and educational resources

With **7 in 10 Australians affected by musculoskeletal conditions**, costing over **10% of national health spend**², Universal Practice provides a scalable, data-driven solution that improves outcomes and reduces both out-of-pocket and systemic costs. Eligible AIA Health customers will pay \$25 out of pocket for either a two- or ten-week program.

Through Clinical Matching, patients are paired with the physiotherapist best suited to their needs, drawn from a **national network** everywhere spanning Perth, Byron Bay, Alice Springs, and beyond. This model allows physiotherapists to work remotely without compromising care, tackling workforce shortages and the high attrition rates in the profession.

"Al and digital health aren't threats to traditional practice, they're catalysts for scale," says Andrew Prowse, CEO and Co-Founder.

"Our platform merges clinical expertise with intelligent digital systems, letting physiotherapists focus on what they do best while patients receive personalised, data-driven care anytime, anywhere."

This approach builds on Universal Practice's **10+ years of experience in traditional physiotherapy**, ensuring deep clinical expertise underpins the virtual model.
